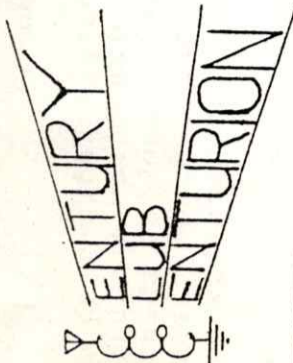

From the Boardroom

Only two actions taken by the Board of Directors in the past quarter has any impact on the activities of the 3905 Century Club Net. They are as follows:

1. A Call Sign Change occurs when there is a change in any of the four elements of a call sign, 1) prefix, 2) call area, 3) suffix, and 4) modifier. A call sign without a change of prefix, call area, and suffix may be used three times in the home state; at the licensed location, portable, and mobile. Unless the license is changed by the FCC specifying a new station address, a call sign may be used two times in a state other than the home state; portable and mobile. NOTE: There are specific awards that do not permit the use of a call more than one time under any condition. When so stated, the rule for the particular certificate will prevail.

2. Presidential Advisory Committee members will now have VIP status.

All hams should have a Junque Box (that's for high-class junk) and your editor is no exception. I listed 20 things I found there in a recent rummaging session. A year's free subscription to the first person who can come up with the most novel resident in his or her Junque Box. We'll be very arbitrary and say the Editor's decision will be final. 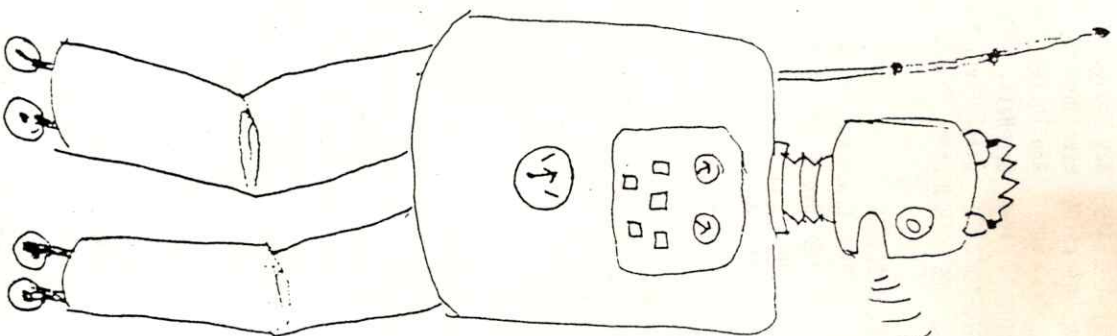

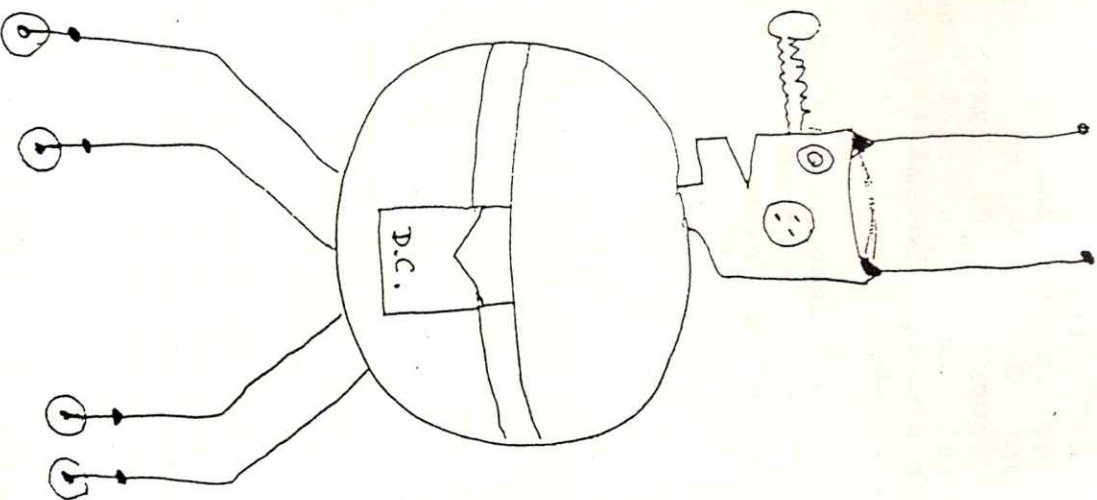
Or Do You Just Belong?
