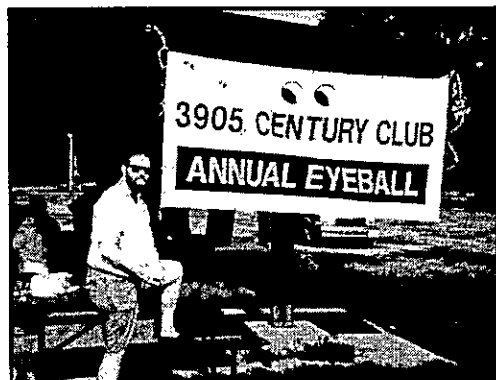
It seems to me that all those that attended had a good time, we seemed to have a lot of members there for their first eyeball and really seemed to be enjoying meeting those faces they have been talking to.

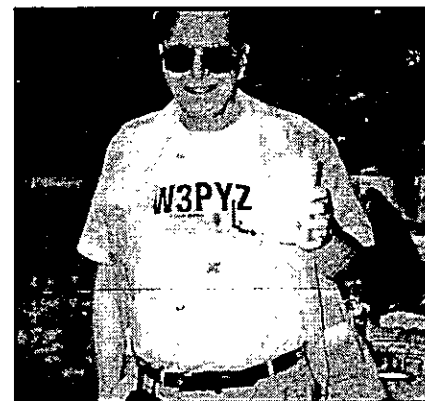

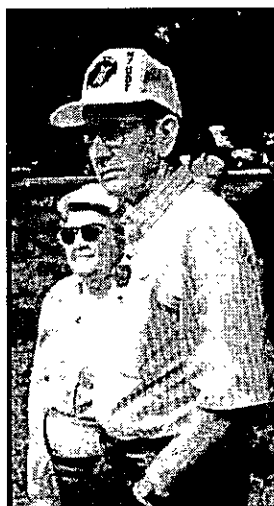

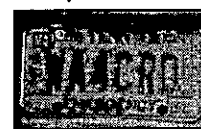

Net Controllers Booster

Hello Century Clubbers:

Well, most folks think that all we do here on the "Rockbound Coast of Main" is sit back and eat Lobsters and Blueberries!!!

We sure do eat our share of Maine Lobsters, the Ambrosia of The Sea, and from time to time, I have been known to partake of a Blueberry or three!!

But, most of the time, I enjoy Hamming, working DX, and trying to work for the many fine Awards that are offered by the 3905 Century Club.

Ah, but there sometimes is a problem!!! Lots of nights, when everyone is at parade rest, waiting to pounce on those rare contacts, NOBODY SHOWS UP TO TAKE NET CONTROL, so there is either NO NET AT ALL, or else we all have to sit on our hands and wait until some unsuspecting soul wanders into the field of fire, and volunteers to be Net Control for the evening!!!!

To help out all of us who are routinely disappointed by not having a Net Control Station show up to start the Net, I have submitted some suggestions to the Board of Directors which would enhance the meager benefits enjoyed by Net Controls, and hopefully make it interesting enough so that many more folds would volunteer to take Net Control duties!!!

It isn't to complicated, all it would involve would be to allow NCS to have a BONUS CALL PER ROUND, rather than only one bonus call per net!!!! BUT, if I could get one BONUS CALL PER ROUND, and be able to work any Late Checkins as they checked in, I would

I would rather drive several hundred miles, and spend money for fuel, to give out Capitals and rare States and Provinces!!!

If the majority of the Board of Directors went along with my proposed changes, we would all benefit by having more NCS's than we need, and never having to stand by waiting for someone to pick up the Net.

So 3905ers, if you would just let your Area Director know that you support any changes that would make the NCS's job more enjoyable and help us all make more and better contacts, the Board of Directors would be able to do what we elect them to do, they could represent us, and make changes that would be of benefit to all of the 3905 Club Members!!

So, I ask that you consider contacting your Area Director, and letting them know that you want improvements in the benefits available to Net Controls, so that we can continue to have Nets, and more folks will be motivated to volunteer to be Net Control Stations on 3905 Century Club Nets!!

By the time this appears in print, we will be heading for fall, and I'd like to ask

you to give some thought to getting on 160 Meters this Fall and Winter. It doesn't take much effort to erect an Antenna for 160, though it does take a lot of room, so if you have Real Estate enough to get up a 160 dipole, you can get on a real nice band, and maybe be the last 160 contact I need for W.A.S. or some other Award from the Century Club...

Hope to work a lot of you from Hartford, Ct., and Albany, NY. this fall, probably in the middle of October!! If you need Quebec or New Brunswick, or Nova Scotia, on 40 or 75 Meters, drop me a line, and if I get enough interest, I will run all of them from my Mobile again this Fall!!

Daily there are Late Nets on 75 and 40 meters that start after the regular closing time for the Early Nets and they operate for approximately 3 hours.

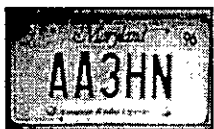
M, W, F 40 Mtrs 70333-7035khz 0200-0400z (CW Net)
