## Eyeball Update

This year the Eyeball is being held in Cheyenne, WY. Your host is Ken Rathbone, KG7KO.

Cheyenne is located in the southeast corner of Wyoming, 10 miles north of the Colorado border, and 40 miles west of the Nebraska line. Cheyenne is the state capital. It is also the largest city in Wyoming with 50,000 residents. For anyone with respiratory problems, Cheyenne is pretty high at 6200 feet. I'll not set up any touch football games. Harry, W7KKJ, is planning on being here with extra oxygen for those who may need it.

Summer in Wyoming is usually warm days (about 80 to 90) and cool evenings (about 50 to 60). We also have been known to have a little weather during that time of the year. Thunderstorms are not unheard of and wind makes an occasional showing.

For entertainment around Cheyenne, there is a Mall, movie theaters, several museums, the State Capitol building, and three golf courses. We also have a dinner theater which produces a melodrama for the summer. Can be a lot of fun to boo the villain! There are also the majority of chain eateries and several Cheyenne only restaurants which are good.

As for the Eyeball itself, I have chosen A&B Camping as the location. A&B is very accessible to both I-80 and I-25. The owner has promised us priority sites, especially for those reserving early. The picnic area, and tent site will be reserved totally for us. Non-Century Club tents will be moved to another location in the campground. The only request that the owner has is that we don't all show up at 10am on Friday and want to be parked immediately. The meal on Saturday, as of this writing will be a milk can dinner, Which I have eaten and can vouch that it is very tasty and good.

The standard fare for the Eyeball will be here. Bingo for those who are interested. Those who are entrepreneurs can bring up to 5 items for sale.

Door prizes will be given for both hams and non-hams. I am setting up a Cheyenne trolley to come by the campground to give those who may want to a unique way to see Cheyenne and F. E. Warren Air Force Base. I am also looking into the possibility that Terry Ranch will send a bus out to us and give those who wish a tour for the buffalo herd.

I own 2 transceivers - TS-520, and an IC-730, have a couple of 300W wire antennas which we can use. I can probably come up with another one or two, but hopefully there will be additional radios available in case of problems. The eyeball area is not huge so it would help if someone brought vertical antennas for the 75 and 80 meters nets. If someone wishes to carry their amplifiers along, they probably should be 110 vac. A couple rolls of coax will also help, we may have to set up a couple of runs up to 50 - 75 feet long.
