First got into Ham radio at age 14 when the town (Lincoln RI) was looking for operators to run the town civil defense radios. Through my training there, I met a lot of hams and was instantly taken in by ham radio. One of the older hams seeing a number of us having an interest in radio, conducted a novice class for about 8 of us. Then, the class lasted about 10 weeks because in addition to the theory, we had to learn the code at 5 wpm. It seemed like the younger people in the class picked up the code easier than the older ones. Anyway I passed and waited weeks for my first call sign. (KN1DWI) My first rig was an RME45 and a Viking 2. Because I only had a year to upgrade to general, I spent a lot of time on 80,40 and 15cw.

Fortunately I passed my general even dealing with a nasty old FCC examiner in Boston. What a thrill it was to finally work phone (AM) I still think about all the contacts I made using real simple antennas.

In 1961 I graduated from High School and went into the Air Force where I spent 20 years. Because of so many things I was involved in (work and girls) I let my license lapse .Sound familiar???

Well after retirement from the Air Force, We moved to New Hampshire where I obtained a teaching position, teaching paramedics where we lived for 25 years. Because I was involved in Emergency Medicine, I had a scanner.

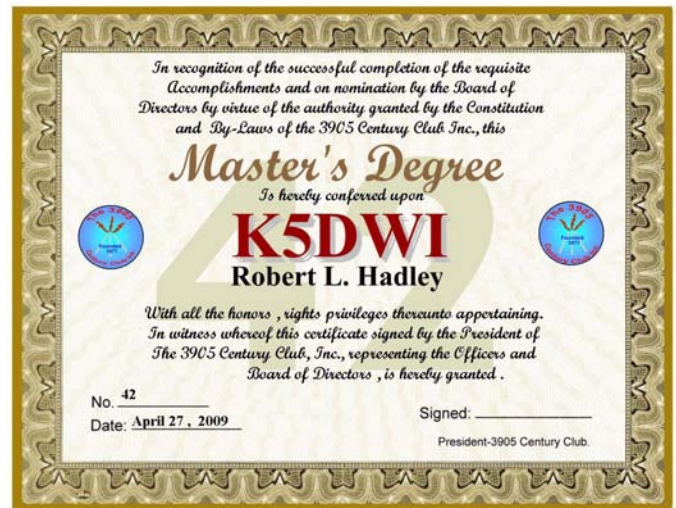
Well one night while listening to the scanner I thought I would look at what would be on the 2 meter band.

While listening I heard of a new Novice class that was beginning in town. That's all it took and I was hooked again. This was in 1993 when the old license classifications was still in force. So I started over again leaning the theory and brushing up on my code. My second novice license was KB1AYP.

I was able to upgrade pretty quickly to general and my first goal was to WAS. Someone told me about the century club and I started to check in (Just about every night on 75) Anyone out there have a card from KB1AYP??Well I continued to upgrade to advanced (KD1TU

) and then extra (AA1LU). At that time there was only 2 members with Masters . (AB6TX and KC1NA) I never thought I could ever reach that level. After getting my first 1k award on 75, I started to check into the other nets (40.160 and CW nets). I was able to attend two eyeballs in 96 and 98 and really enjoyed meeting many of the folks I had talked to on the nets.

In 1996, the vanity calls came into being and I wondered if I could get my old call back..Sure enough I then became K1DWI after 30 years.



In 2005 we decided to leave the cold northeast and move to a warmer climate. At that time I had just retired again from the state of New Hampshire. Because we had lived for a few years in Mississippi we decided that that's where we would like to retire. Prior to that decision, I had made contact with a ham who lives in Brookhaven (W0XV) and told him about our desire to move to Mississippi. He invited us to come down and visit this town. After visiting Brookhaven we knew that this is where we wanted to move. We arrived here in Sept 2005, three days after Katrina hit this area. Fortunately our new home was spared from any damage.

Of course one of the factors involved in moving into our new home was the ability to put up antennas which worked out well as there was plenty of pine trees spaced just where I needed them. After moving in all the furniture and STUFF, my next priority was setting up my ham station. I first operated as K1DWI portable 5 and then changed to K1DWI Mississippi. Only stayed with that call for a short time as I wanted my call sign to reflect my location. So back to the vanity calls. K5DWI was open so I applied again and hopefully that will be my last call sign. So overall I have put 6 different call signs on the century club net.

At some point after going over my awards I found that all I needed for my Masters was RTTY. To be honest, I didn't have a lot of interest in operating the digital modes, but I knew that if I was ever to obtain my masters I would have to get my 100 points on that mode. So I bought a rig blaster and learned to operate RTTY where I finally obtained my 100 points on that mode. That's all it took and I finally obtained my Masters #42 in April 2009. I guess I could have obtained it earlier if I had put in more effort.

Right now my rig is a PRO3 and a Carolina window and a 6 element log periodical along with an amplifier. I still enjoy checking into the nets but must admit that after receiving my masters I obtained my goal and wish that there was a higher goal to work for on the 3905 century club. I hope that this might occur in the future. .

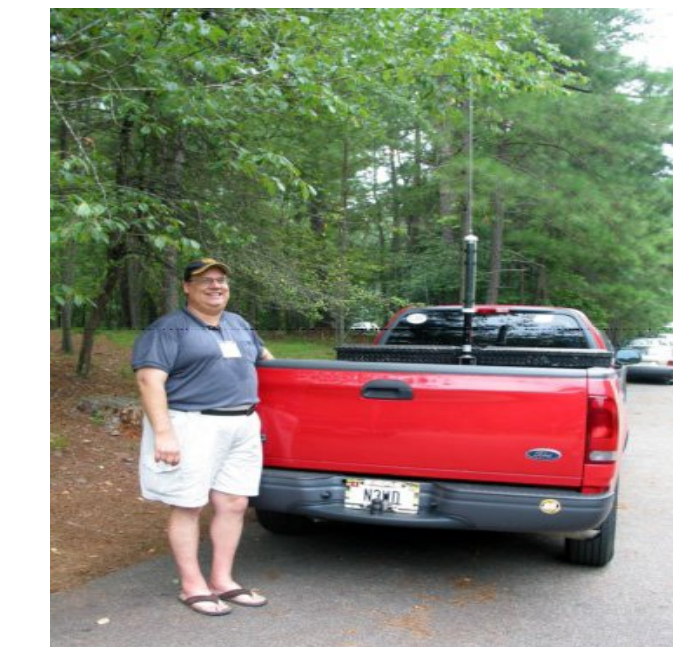

Master's Degree By Default, Almost

I first learned of what was to be the 3.905 CCN when it was the bi-centennial net in 1976. I was WA3ZER in those days. Then came my senior year of high school followed by college and I was not very active. When I finally found the time for ham radio again it was 1981. I found the 3.905 CCN and worked a few stations on 75 and found the group to be pleasant. I worked some contacts off and on for the next 14 years on the CCN net. I re-found the group in 1995 and started to make contacts now as N3WD on a long wire up 15 feet and 100 watts. The first Century Club net I checked into was in late 1988 as WA1QZC. My call changed to KC1NI and WB1I in 1990. I was on regularly through 1992 and accumulated about 1500 QSL cards. From 1993 through 2008 I was not on the nets much at all.

Last year I put up a 4 square antenna for 40M to chase DX with. The entire setup was homebrew and I wanted to get some signal reports to verify that everything was working. On October 16th I checked into the net figuring that I could get my signal reports. I worked 22 stations that night and have been hooked on the Century Club ever since.

Many things have changed since the early 90's. I think the web site, the logger, the chat and the groups on the reflector all make the club more fun. The other thing that was new to me was the Masters award. When I first read the requirements I thought it would be impossible. Then last December, I read a Centurion article where NN5G explained his approach which made good sense to me. I set a goal to get #50 (or less) – I thought it would take two years.

In February I sent letters to 15 stations in AK and HI. Every station I wrote to either sent me an email or joined the nets. The CCN family is full of great people!



The most fun awards were the Nomad awards. I took a week off from work in early March and went mobile on both 40M and 80M in the six New England states plus New York. I had a great time doing it and I'm looking forward to going out again.

By early May I only needed one more contact to finish. It wasn't Alaska, Hawaii, 75M DX or a Poker Player contact...it was one Bakers Dozen contact. Just then KD4POJ and WT0A went on a cross country mobile tour and I worked Dwayne in 13 states in 8 days.

There isn't enough room in the whole Centurion to properly thank every one who helped me along the way. Thanks everyone from #45!

Master Journey

Miles (Gene) Marsh, W8NET

A Master Degree Award on the 3905 Century Club is a prestigious award – and a tough one. It requires a variety of operating practices, operating on a lot of nets, and – most importantly – an approach that will get you there.

My journey started February 12, 2008 when I made my first contact on the Century Club with CU2JT on as K8NET. Sixteen months and eight days later, after 4,408 contacts, I had my Master. Sounds simple, right? Well, some parts are pretty easy. Others are really tough! Before I go any further, I need to pay homage to some folks here.

Everyone who has recently obtained their Master award will, I am sure, readily agree with this. The Master Degree Award is very difficult to get, and requires a huge commitment to complete. However, with the changes to licensing including vanity and club licenses, it is not as excruciatingly hard as it once was. I tip my hat to those early Masters who did not have these recent advantages. The number of contacts they had to make, and the diligence to complete the Master Degree Award is astounding.

A real bonus for me in the Master pursuit was getting on the digital nets. I had never run RTTY before, and it had been 17 years since I had used CW (and I'm still rusty and slow). The great news is that there are lots of other club members willing to step up and help you out with these modes. These modes are a lot of fun and another way to work for awards on the Century Club.

If you have taken a look at the Master Award application, the big hairy monster award you need to get is the Poker Player Award. This is a very tough award. Look at the requirement for the Straight Flush and Royal Flush on this award. AAARRRGGGHHH! You will need a combination of luck and a diligent examination of both your contacts and the stations checking in to the nets to get this one. The designers of this award knew exactly what they were doing (and they probably regularly kicked their dog and tortured flies, etc.)

When you apply for your Master, you specify "Band 1" (your "top band") and "Band 2" (your "second band"). I had thought for some time that my top band would be 40m, since I had so many more "good contacts", YLs, DX, etc. Then, out of the blue, I discovered that I needed only one more card to complete the Poker Player Award on 75m. My strategy immediately changed. I was able to complete this award on 75m – but that left me with a couple other issues: I was short a couple YL contacts on 75m for WAS-YL, and though I had enough contacts for the DX Award on 75m, I was short 3 cards. The YL contacts came with time, and then eQSL and luck came to the rescue. Through eQSL I was able to get confirmation on two of the DX contacts, and the last DX card to complete the DX Award arrived in the mail – three months after it had been sent! To make it even more fantastic, the eQSL confirmations and the mailed card arrived on the same day! (I should have played the lottery that day!)



The Master Degree Award is not for everyone. It does not make you a better operator or better net member. It does carry with it some prestige and a large amount of humility. If you really want to pursue it, there are things you can do to help you get there: Work the mobile stations, especially those who are well out of place from where they normally operate. Work the DX stations, especially on 75m Work the YL stations Work the unusual prefixes ,BE A NET CONTROL STATION

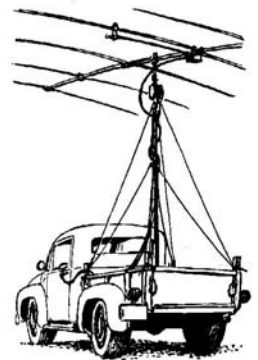
I first signed into the CCN nets on 8/25/08 and the board approved my masters on 8/25/09. It took me exactly one year to get masters. N2XTT was the first one to contact me and the first one I contacted was KB5GVR. The first awards I earned were 160M 100 point and NCS. The hardest award for me was the WAS YLS. The last call I received for masters was from KC2PUF/M VA on 4/18/09. My next goal is WAS YLS-50 states and DXCC. I believe I am the youngest master so far at 20 years old. Look forward to more contacts.



Antenna Shoot Out Cont.

All radios are tested on 7.178 with the same radio/ Bird watt meter and dummy load mounted on a platform along with a CW key and antenna switch. We have a receiving loop antenna that is calibrated using an antenna analyzer to the frequency, then it is hooked to a digital volt meter.

The test spot is located one wave length from the loop antenna, you can orient the vehicle any way you like. The test rig is put in the vehicle and plugged into the 12 volt port, and radio is keyed and adjusted for 10 watts. This is shown to the tester, the antenna switch is turned from the watt meter to their antenna and three key downs are done and the readings are measured in milivolts on the voltmeter. The three readings are averaged and the scores are recorded. We had 14 people test this year and all testing went well.
